God's Faithfulness in Our Fragility

Over the past four weeks in Genesis 20-23, we saw that God remains faithful even when His people struggle. Abraham returned to old fears, yet God intervened because of His promise, not perfection. Fulfilled promises brought both joy and complexity, surrender was required, and grief reminded us that faith does not remove sorrow, but God is still building future hope.

What we learned:

God is faithful when fear resurfaces.
God keeps promises on His timeline.
God invites surrender, not perfection.
God is present in grief.

Now we move into Genesis 24-27, where we explore relationships, identity, and trusting God when outcomes feel uncertain. **These chapters remind us that God works through imperfect people and messy situations. Fearless Sister, trust Him with both the promise and the process.**

Week One

God Provides the Right Helper in the Right Time


Read the entirety of Genesis 24: 1-67. Highlight Genesis 24:10-27 and write down what stands out to you.

DON'T FORGET

We encourage you to research the definitions of words that stand out to you, discover commentary from biblical scholars and seek guidance from your sisters within our Fearless Community.

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Week One

Read and discuss with your community:

Reflect back on Genesis 24:10-27. **In this chapter we watch Abraham's servant pray specifically for God's guidance and see God answer before the servant finishes speaking.** This passage reminds us that God hears our prayers even before we know how to pray them fully.

- Where do you see God's faithful provision in your life right now?

Hebrew word study: נְאִמָּנוּת (ne'emanut) — faithfulness, reliability, trustworthiness.

- Just as God faithfully guided the servant, He remains trustworthy in guiding our steps today.

Where is God calling you to believe that He is "ne-emanut"?


Week One

Read and discuss with your community:

- Read Philippians 1:6 and write it below:

- What good work has God started ***in you or your life***, that you're called to believe He will complete it? This can apply to you personally, your loved ones or a season of life.

- We see a promise from God in the new testament that applied to Abraham and Issac's life in the Old Testament. His promises are a binding agreement. That means, they will never fail. **What are you trusting Him for and are you believing He already hears you? If not, share why you struggle. If so, share why you trust Him:**

TAKE HEART

Sister, we all have some sort of “trust issues.” No matter how good of a family you’ve come from, or relationships you’ve had. Why? Because people fail us, time and time again. Life has a way of being...well, you know...life. Chaotic, painful, and uncertain. But the ONE thing that remains is the gospel of Jesus Christ. He chose you and BEFORE He chose you, God chose you and created you in His perfect image.

He began a good work in you and your life, for you but more importantly...for His kingdom. For ALL to know, they’re loved, chosen and seen by Him.

So how can we take heart in this season or the next season or even moment that hits you with uncertainty? **Even when the plan seems uncertain, God is arranging the details.** He sees you. He hears you. He cares deeply for your future and even in the unknown.

LET THIS BE YOUR PRAYER

Lord, help me to trust Your timing and Your ways. Teach me to pray boldly and expect that Your ways are ne’emanut (faithful, trustworthy).

When I begin to doubt, help remind me in community and through Your Word to look back on your faithfulness.

Week Two:

One-on-one time with God:

Sister, this is your time:

Over the course of this next week, God wants you to reflect on His power in your life, how to live out the legacy He has called for you, and depend on Him in every season and moment of your life. We'll reflect on Psalm 102:18 and how that applies to the Old Testament, New Testament and our lives today.

- Read Genesis 25:1-34 and write down what stands out to you.

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- We just learned of the death of Abraham, the birth of Esau and Jacob, and the beginnings of choices that shape destiny.

The Hebrew word to focus on this week is: בָּרָךְ (berakah) which means blessing. A deep spiritual favor from God that shapes identity and destiny.

How can we look at the blessings in this passage? How has this deep spiritual favor from God over Abraham shape the destiny and identity of His lineage?

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
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Week Two

One-on-one time with God:



Remember:

- The Hebrew word בָּרוּךְ (berakah) highlights the blessing from generations into generations. Maybe you're feeling like I'm not sure what my parents were favored with, or what blessings they passed down to me...Abraham made MANY mistakes, yet He was known for the promise God gave HIM and then finally...How he answered it.

Think of one blessing your parents have passed onto you, and thank God below. **This is honoring both your parents and acknowledging your heavenly Father who will never fail you:**

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
Sister, don't forget:

You can change the outcome of future generations. God has given you that authority in the name and power of Jesus. The legacy He has called you to create is all-consuming, and life-changing. How do we know this?

- Read Psalm 102:18 and write it below:

One-on-one time with God:


TAKE A CLOSER LOOK

In Psalm 102:18, you read “so that a generation not yet created may praise the Lord.” That is the best legacy to create and leave your family. When you discover the love and light of Jesus...It changes everything. Your thoughts. Your actions. and your destiny.

- **Read Paul's writing in Romans 9:10-13 and write down what stands out to you.** Remember, His writing is to a generation of people and reflection of what has occurred in the Old Testament.

Where do you question God's plan for you? Where do you question God in the passage above in Romans and also in Genesis 25? The legacy He has called you to create for your family? REFLECT BELOW


- Where have you seen God's blessing in unexpected places? How do you respond when people or situations challenge your spiritual identity?

TAKE HEART

Sister, we have to remember this one truth when the enemy or the world tries to whisper into our mind... God's blessings aren't always tied to our performance or status. **He calls, equips, and blesses according to His purpose, not ours. How does this truth set you free?**

LET THIS BE YOUR PRAYER

Lord, give me a heart that seeks Your blessing and not the world's or my family's approval. Teach me to walk in Your calling with courage and humility. Amen.

Read and discuss with your community:


- Read and reflect on Genesis 26:1-35 and write down what stands out to you.

- God reaffirms His covenant with Isaac as fear tempts compromise. Where has fear tempted you to compromise?

TALKING WITH GOD

- **The Hebrew word to focus on this week is: נָסָר (pala')** which means marvelous, extraordinary, wondrous. God's blessings may come in ways we do not anticipate, showing His hand at work even when life feels uncertain.

Share one time where God stepped in a way you didn't anticipate. If you can't recall one, write a prayer down to ask God to bring one to mind:


SISTER, WE NEED TO REFLECT:

In Genesis 26, *like Abraham before him*, Isaac faced fear of lack and danger. Instead of trusting God, he made wrong choices that led to repeated patterns of fear. YET... God reaffirms His covenant and blesses Isaac abundantly.

- Read and reflect over Matthew 6:25-34. Write below what stands out to you:

- What fears are shaping your decisions more than God's promises?

- How do you need to remember God's pala' ways? Whether it's through biblical stories or your own life?


GOOD NEWS

Isaac faced fear and uncertainty, yet God blessed him in extraordinary ways. **N79 (pala')** reminds us that **God's provision is wondrous beyond our understanding**. As Jesus says in Matthew 6:25-36, we do not need to worry about our needs; God sees and provides marvelously.

- How can we stop our fear from turning into worry/anxious thoughts in the moment?

Sister, let's be real. What Matthew 6 IS NOT SAYING, is that you won't feel the emotion of fear. IT IS NOT SAYING, to ignore your feelings and "just have a positive mindset." IT IS SAYING, fear is an emotion, and alerts us to bring that emotion to the Father. That being said, faith and fear cannot abide with one another.

We need to fight fear with remembrance of who God is and how He has shown up in your life or the lives before you. When we remind ourselves with God's truth and a single faith-based thought about 7-8 times (even if we have doubt) it rewires our neuropath-ways to have the response of faith.



Week Three

TAKE HEART

We get it...Sometimes the enemy or even our own thought patterns can then beat ourselves up over the fact that we allow our fear to turn into anxiety. That's not the case. Sometimes anxiety can be beyond our control when it comes to our minds...whether it's a chemical imbalance, or mental illness/condition.


That doesn't mean we beat ourselves up over moments full of anxiety. The enemy wants you to feel sorry for yourself or feel shame so much so that you don't bring it to the Father.

Remember...God's faithfulness does not depend on your perfect obedience. His covenant stands firm because of His character.

MAKE THIS YOUR PRAYER

Lord, I come to you with my fears, questions and doubt. I know you love me and you will provide in every way possible...emotionally, physically and mentally. Help me with my unbelief, and help me rewire my mind with your truth when fear invades.

Enable in me the sound mind, power and love you have given me as 2 Timothy 1:7 shares. Thank you for loving me, unconditionally. In Jesus' name, amen.

One-on-one time with God:

Sister, this is your time:

When it comes to creating or leaving a legacy worthwhile, we first have to acknowledge what we need to work through so we can be aware of God's instructions and not blinded by our circumstances. In Genesis 27, we'll discover the weight of manipulation and the grace of God. Let's dive in!


- Read Genesis 27:1-46 and write down what stands out to you.

- We see a family struggling under deception, fear, and human manipulation. Yet even here, God's overarching plan continues. We are reminded that God's purposes are not thwarted by human weakness.

- Oftentimes we try to manipulate the outcome, or answer because of our lack of surrender to God. That lack of surrender comes from lack of repentance/trust in God.


Where is God calling you to repentance or restoration?

GOOD NEWS

Hebrew word study this week is: תְּשׁוּעָה (teshuah).

**Teshuah means, deliverance, salvation, rescue.
Even when life feels chaotic and crooked, God offers
deliverance and redemption.**

Sister, we get it. It's incredibly hard to not try and manipulate the outcome, to give over full surrender to God when life feels chaotic and unfair. BUT, when we are available to see God's hand in our lives, and say time and time again - "God help me give this to you. I give this to you" until you believe it fully, you'll experience His deliverance and redemption in only a way He can provide.

- Read and reflect over 2 Corinthians 4:8-18 and write what stands out to you:


- After reading both Genesis 27 and 2 Corinthians 4:8-18, when you are “pressed” on every side, what are 3 obtainable ways/goals you can move forward in faith?

TAKE HEART

Yes, life's challenges can lead us to choices we regret, but God's goodness still flows through brokenness. His deliverance (teshuah) restores what fear has fractured when we continually surrender, to follow His plan and seek support within our community of sisters.

SISTER, LET THIS BE YOUR PRAYER


